## Murrieta All Star Marching Band

The Murrieta All Star Band participated in the 2020 London New Year's Day Parade. The band was comprised of students from all three high schools. It was lead by Murrieta Mesa High School band director Daniel Greenberg. He was assisted by Murrieta Valley High School band director Brad Pulverenti.

The students spent six days in London. During their visit they toured the Tower of London, the National Observatory at Greenwich, Windsor Castle, and Oxford. They also took a boat cruise on the River Thames, and witnessed the changing of the guards at Buckingham Palace.

The band performed a concert at Cadogan Hall, home of the London Philharmonic Society. Cadogan Hall was formerly the Church of Christ, Science church, built in 1907.


On New Year's Day, the Murrieta All Star Band marched the

two mile parade route. The students traveled through Piccadilly Circus, London's version of Time Square. They then traversed through Trafalgar Square passing by the National Portrait Gallery. The parade route

ended near the Westminster Bridge. For their finale piece, the students performed, "Can't Take my Eyes off of you". The crowds cheered, and the students were highly praised for their achievements.

Phil Brigandi (1959 – 2019)

On December 12, 2019, Southern California lost one of its great "libraries". Phillip K. Brigandi, the Orange County Historian and Archivist died at the age of 60. He wrote over 25 books, 100 articles, and assisted in many other projects. In 1998, he published the book, "Temecula at the Crossroads of History". He was an incredible storyteller and had an unquenchable passion for local history.


